INFORMATION SHARING FRAMEWORK

To keep security tight while still enabling coordination — use a tiered information system.

◆ CLEARANCE TIERS ◆

TIER	WHO	INFORMATION ACCESS	EXAMPLES
PUBLIC	Anyone interested	Basic preparedness education	Survival guides, checklists, disaster readiness info
LOCAL MEMBERS	Verified participants	Community plans, contact rosters, cache locations (<i>local only</i>)	Local drills, mutual aid rosters
REGIONAL COORDINATORS	Trusted leaders	Regional logistics, cross-group coordination, supply routing	Inventory summaries, comms protocols
NATIONAL LEADERSHIP	Core trusted council	Strategic directives, full logistics picture, secure comm protocols	Encryption keys, national-level contingency plans

◆ INFORMATION THAT SHOULD NEVER BE WIDELY SHARED ◆

⚠ RESERVED FOR TOP-TIER LEADERSHIP OR COMPARTMENTALIZED CELLS ONLY

- ✗ Exact cache or supply coordinates
- ✗ Identity of key members or leaders
- ✗ Operational plans or response routes
- ✗ Encryption keys, frequency lists, or offline comm protocols
- ✗ Full membership rosters
- ✗ Sensitive political or financial data

Know your level. Respect the boundaries. The strength of the network depends on every Squirrel operating within their tier — not above it.
